PREFACE

The present report represents the results of the ten percent sample tabulation concerned with labor force status, occupation, industry, class of worker, and hours worked surveyed in the Census of Population taken on October 1, 1950.

In Volume I the final total population count for the whole country, in Volume II results of the one percent sample tabulation and in Volume III part I results of the ten percent sample tabulation (sex, age, marital status, citizenship, education, household, housing, and fertility) have already been published. The present volume is to follow them and this is the last volume for the results of the sample tabulation. Volume IV and subsequent volumes to be published successively will deal with the hundred percent tabulation.

In using the report care must be taken to note that the statistics presented in this volume are estimates, as is stated in Outline of Ten Percent Sample Tabulation Method, based on a sample tabulation and subject to sampling error. The one percent tabulation in Volume II provides general information on sex, age, labor force status, occupation and industry for the country, all shi and all gun. The ten percent tabulation in Volume III provides more detailed information on all items for the whole country, furnishing at the same time with information by prefectures and six largest cities on principal items. The present tabulation, therefore, may be said to constitute the most important part of the Census of Population of 1950. A synthetic explanation and analysis of the figures for the ten percent as well as the complete counts will be given in the final report.

Special acknowledgement is due to Mrs. Esther M. Wright Blagg of the former Economic Scientific Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, for her valuable information and suggestion given for the planning and tabulation of this Census.
